



FIRST READING: Genesis 9:8-15 Today's reading from the book of Genesis takes place after the story of Noah and the great flood. Israelite people of long ago saw the rainbow as a symbol of a Warrior-God hanging up his hunting bow as a peaceful gesture. The rainbow symbolizes the solemn promise that God makes to Noah.

**SECOND READING:** 1 Peter 3:18-22 This reading reminds us that just as Noah was saved through the ark, we are saved through baptism. Early Christians believed that those who died before the coming of Jesus awaited redemption in a shadowy existence described here as a prison. When we say in the Apostles' Creed that Jesus "descended into hell," we are saying that Jesus went to announce to those waiting in that "prison" that they had been saved.

#### REFLECTIONS BY LUKE BROWN | SACRED HEART COUNSELING

Who decided to put Ash Wednesday on Valentine's Day this year?! After growing up on a beef ranch, a date night without a steak is not a date, but I digress. Valentine's Day is a holiday that I often hear about in my counseling work. People often have moderate to high expectations about how the day will go and some end up very hurt and heartbroken when things do not turn out how they imagined. Every relationship has its ups and downs and no relationship is perfect, but sometimes we can feel like our relationship is stagnant or "in a rut" for a long time. If this is the case, couples counseling should be a consideration. I often meet people who are very resistant to counseling in general and even more so to attending counseling as a couple. When I hear this, I understand why, but I also like to challenge people to understand that attending counseling does not mean that you are "crazy," weak, or lacking intelligence. As the stigma around mental health has improved over time, I still find people that will encourage others to attend counseling but will be very resistant about attending it themselves. Another consideration is that counseling sometimes requires second and third chances. Sometimes there are counselors we have a difficult time connecting with and sometimes there are counselors who are subpar. These are not reasons to give up. If counseling could improve your relationship, would you do it? This is the blunt question that needs to be asked sometimes when we find ourselves in a rut. If this reflection resonates with you, consider giving couples counseling a chance to improve your relationship.



But the menu has many other items on it as well so take a look in our bulletin & on our website for the menu and for prices. Please invite your neighbors, family & friends to join you as I do.

I liked these words which come from Luke Brown from Sacred Heart Counseling regarding giving something up during Lent: "It is easy to miss the deeper meaning behind the sacrifice when we get in the routine of giving something up and not examining it further. The point is not to "white-knuckle" our way through Lent with whatever we have given up only to binge on Easter morning. If this is our attitude, we have missed the point. Our goal should be to change our relationship with what we have given up instead of simply returning to it on Easter morning. This is why we are called to give up things that we enjoy in a sacrificial way. If we give up ice cream, the goal is that we will learn to turn to God in prayer instead of ice cream when we have had a difficult day and need relief. The hope is that we will take this lesson out of Lent and use it in our spiritual growth and journey to union with Christ. This week, consider reflecting on the deeper meaning of God's call to sacrifice and how your sacrifice can be used as a way to grow closer to Christ.'

Prayer to End Use of the Death Penalty

Merciful Father, we ask your blessing on all we do to build a culture of life. Hear our prayers for those impacted by the death penalty. We pray for all people, that their lives and dignity as children of a loving God may be respected and protected in all stages and circumstances. We pray for victims of violence and their families, that they may experience our love and support and find comfort in your compassion and in the promise of eternal life. We pray for those on death row, that their lives may be spared, that the innocent may be freed and that the guilty may come to acknowledge their faults and seek reconciliation with you. We pray for the families of those who are facing execution, that they may be comforted by your love and compassion.


