

First Reading: Genesis 12:1-4

The first 11 chapters of Genesis have very little historical foundation but they teach religious truths in parable form. Today we begin the 12th chapter which contains stories with identifiable historical roots. The first of these is the call of Abraham, whose original name was "Abram".

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:8-10

The second letter to Timothy, although probably written some 30 years after Paul's death, was written in his name. This was an acceptable practice at that time. It was not a forgery, but an acknowledged way of continuing someone's spirit and authority. In this passage, the author encourages the readers in the face of trials.

Dear Parishioners.

Some parishioners reminded us (thank you) that it's been a while since we've celebrated the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick during weekend Mass. I like to do this at least twice a year and it's actually been over a year since we last did this. So this Sunday we will offer the sacrament during the 11am Mass. Next weekend it will be offered during the 4pm Mass (March 14th) & the following Sunday during the 8am Mass (March 22nd). If you are experiencing a serious illness, or would just like to be anointed due to "advanced age" (your call, not mine!), the Church invites you to receive this sacrament whereby we pray for healing in whatever way God chooses to give it to us, be it physical, emotional, or spiritual. Many people ask me to anoint them at other times after Mass when they are facing a surgery or serious medical procedure and I am very happy to do that as well whenever requested. So feel free to ask so that the Church's prayers and God's sacramental grace may accompany you.

Our first Fish Fry went very well. We had about ½ take out and ½ eat in. The menu varies slightly from year to year so as to provide both stability but also variety. But due to popular request, we are now offering the opportunity to pay by credit card. You can swipe (Visa, MasterCard, American Express or Discover) or tap (using Apple Pay or Google Pay) or insert (for a card with a chip). So all the options available with a credit card. This will be in addition to checks or cash. So be sure to join us this Friday for a great meal and enjoyable company. And don't forget the Lobster meal that will be offered on Friday, March 27th. You must purchase tickets for this in advance through our rectory office.

A few years ago the Diocese began to offer an "Evening of Confessions" which takes place at every parish of the Diocese to make it convenient for people to take advantage of this sacrament of forgiveness. The Evening of Confessions for this year is this Wednesday, March 11th. from 5-8pm. Again, that should be offered at every parish, and of course will be available in our own. I will be here along with Father O'Grady and perhaps Father Vesely as well (at least for part of the time). Please enter through the doors by the chapel where there will be handouts you are welcome to use to help you prepare for your confession. There are 2 reconciliation rooms in the hallway off of the chapel and the name of the priest inside is on the door. As always you can choose to sit face to face with the priest or you can sit or kneel behind the screen. The Act of Contrition (prayer of sorrow) is always displayed so you need not worry about remembering it. We especially welcome those who have been away from the sacrament and for some that may have been for several years. Remembering what Jesus said about there being "more joy in heaven over one repentant sinner," we are truly happy to receive with joy anyone who has been away from the Church and/or sacrament for some time. This is the time to return!

The Cleveland Scholarship Program and EdChoice Expansion Scholarship Application Period IS NOW!

This program provides new educational choices for children in kindergarten through twelfth grade. The program gives students the opportunity to attend private schools in Cleveland. The State will provide reimbursement for tuition to help pay the cost of attending these schools. Even if your child already attends one of these schools, you may be eligible to apply for the program.

The application period opened February 1st. This is a valuable program that can aid parents in providing their children with quality education at no or very little tuition costs to them. All Information about scholarships available and the application process is available through the School Office

If you live in Cleveland, you really need to get Information on this valuable program. The Scholarship will follow your child through High School. Most surrounding private High Schools accept the Cleveland Scholarship.

Do you live in Parma, or other surrounding areas? You may qualify for the EdChoice Expansion Scholarhsip. This is an Income Based Scholarship for students living outside of Cleveland.

The **Deadline** for the Cleveland Scholarship and the EdChoice Expansion is **APRIL 30**, **2020**.

MARCH 8, 2020—SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT



During Lent, St. Leo's is sponsoring our annual Have-a-Heart, Lend-a-Hand program to benefit 12 charities. Baskets of hearts are placed at all the church entrances. Please take a heart (or two) and purchase the item requested on it for the organization listed. Items can be dropped off in the school cafeteria during mass times Palm Sunday weekend, April 4/5. If you are unable to purchase anything, please take a heart and keep that organization in your Lenten prayers.

This year we are helping 12 area organizations. Following are brief descriptions of how each one helps others.

BIRTHRIGHT—a nonprofit group that provides testing, counseling, and medical and financial resources to women facing unplanned pregnancies.

BROADVIEW MULTI-CARE AND PARMA CARE CENTER—both skilled nursing facilities that provide short and long-term care needs for adults.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES REFUGEE SERVICES—Cleveland Diocesan agency that resettles refugees and provides services for them to become self-sufficient in the U.S.

HOLY FAMILY HOSPICE—a Catholic Charities agency in Parma that provides health care and social services to patients facing a terminal illness.

MALACHI HOUSE—cares for the terminally ill in Cleveland who have no caregiver or no available funds to pay—"a home for the dying poor."

JOSEPH HOUSE OF CLEVELAND—serves the St. Clair/Superior Ave. neighborhood by providing housing and a clothing bank for area neighbors and refugee families.

BACK DOOR MINISTRY OF ST. MALACHI PARISH—provides breakfast and lunch 365 days a year to anyone who comes to the serving window.

PROVIDENCE HOUSE—offers free, voluntary emergency shelter to children newborn through 12 years old actively living in crisis situations that place them at risk of abuse or neglect.

ST. COLMAN PARISH—on Cleveland's West Side, provides social services for the urban poor: recovery programs, literacy projects and an outreach ministry.

ST. LEO/ST.VINCENT DE PAUL OUTREACH—provides food and aid to those in need within our parish boundaries.

WEST SIDE CATHOLIC CENTER—a social service agency on Cleveland's near West Side that assists those in need of food, shelter and advocacy programs.
