

#### First Reading: Is 22:19-23

In Jerusalem eight centuries before Christ, God spoke through the Prophet Isaiah who is told to address a problem. The "master of the palace"—the equivalent of a secretary of state—was a man named Shebna. God says that he is to be demoted because he used this office for his own advantage. We will hear a description of the investiture of Shebna's successor, Eliakim

#### Second Reading: Romans 11:33-36

Today's reading concludes a part of Paul's letter to the Romans in which he agonizes over the fate of Jewish people who have not accepted Christ. Paul simply leaves the matter in God's hands, and closes with a hymn that talks of the mysterious ways of Divine Providence. You will notice that the ending of this hymn is similar to the way we end every Eucharistic prayer.

It will be hard to see Jerry alone as he would always been seen along with his wife as the two of them have been married for 30 years, each bringing 3 sons with them to the relationship. Maureen was a devout Catholic who read her bible daily, prayed her rosary, and asked St. Jude, her favorite patron saint, for his intercession. I had a wonderful visit with them in their home about a month ago where I anointed Maureen and gave them both Holy Communion. She was a wonderful woman whom I will miss along with many others, especially those in our Seniors group. May she rest in God's peace in the company of St. Jude, St. Patrick and the Blessed Mother. Our parish school had been scheduled to open this Thursday but the opening day has been pushed back to the day after Labor Day in order to give us more time to prepare for a school year that will be remarkably different. Please keep the students and faculty in your prayers as they meet the challenges that will be part of the 2020-21 school year.

We have made many improvements to the school buildings over the years, but the project for this summer is one that will be appreciated by all who use that building besides the students. We are redoing the bathrooms by installing new toilets & stalls in both the boys and girls bathrooms, as well as new urinals, sinks & floor in the boys bathroom. Both bathrooms will also have handicapped accessible stalls for those who use wheelchairs and walkers.

We have resumed renting out the Parish Center, though with a maximum capacity of about 35-40 people. Please call the rectory office if you are interested or you can find more information on our website.

I had mentioned the use of a QR code that would be published in our parish bulletin which would allow you to view a website with the Mass readings for those who like to follow along when the scriptures are proclaimed, but I discovered that it used a different translation than the ones we use at Mass. But I remembered that the Mass readings are available in our free mobile app. In the iPhone App Store, or in the Google Play Store (for Android phones), just search for "Leo the Great" and download this free app to your phone. Click the menu button in the upper left hand corner and choose "Mass Readings". You can also view the livestream of the Mass as well as On Demand videos here as well as many other useful items. We will be constantly updating this mobile app to make sure that the content is current.

I went to the Cleveland Zoo last weekend for a wedding reception in a beautiful room they rent out there. I'm sorry to say that after living here for almost 7 years, this was my first time at the zoo! I learned that those in Cuyahoga County can go there for free on Mondays, and since they have food venders there & since I have relatives who live there (haha), I plan to go there regularly. After all, Pope Francis has said that priests should smell like the sheep of the flock so I'll take him literally & do my best.

August 29. The martyrdom of John the Baptist is one of the most gruesome stories in the New Testament. Yet it is the story of the victory of faith and loyalty over cowardice and hate. A king makes a careless promise and does not have the courage or integrity to do the right thing when his jealous wife takes advantage. This is one of those blunt stories of what living faithfully is all about.

#### Reflection

Each of us has a calling to which we must listen. No one will ever repeat the mission of John, and yet all of us are called to that very mission. It is the role of the Christian to witness to Jesus. Whatever our position in this world, we are called to be disciples of Christ. By our words and deeds, others should realize that we live in the joy of knowing that Jesus is Lord. We do not have to depend upon our own limited resources, but can draw strength from the vastness of Christ's saving grace.
