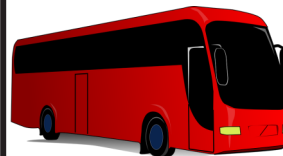
### REMEMBRANCE TREES

**FIRST READING: Jonah 3:1-5, 10** | The Book of Jonah is only two pages long and tells a parable about a man called by God to preach repentance to the pagan city of Nineveh. Jonah's first response was to sail as fast as he could in the other direction. After his adventures with a large fish, God called him a second time. Today's passage picks it up from there.

**SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 7:29-31** | In this section of the first letter to the Corinthians, Paul responds to written questions they had sent to him. Some questions had to do with how we, who believe in the next life, should relate to the things of this life. Paul expected that Jesus would return in glory soon, so he gives some advice which we hear in this reading.

## REFLECTIONS FOR EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

### *A Good Time for Fulfillment*

There are some things that always come at the worst time. I've never gotten a telemarketing call and thought, "This is a really convenient moment for me to listen to a sales pitch." I've never seen the compulsory software update notice flash on my computer screen when I didn't have a deadline I was struggling to meet. My kids never come down with the flu unless it's the weekend and the line at Urgent Care is stretching out the door.

And I never, ever feel the calm, persistent shoulder-tap of the Holy Spirit without thinking, "Now? Now is not a good time. Can you try again when I'm..."

But then I stop and think: when I am what? When I am stronger? When I am happier? When I am smarter? When I am a different person?

When God calls us, He calls the person He sees in front of Him. "Come on," He says, and He doesn't mean "When you're finished" or "When it's convenient" or "Think about it." He means now. This moment.

This is what Paul is saying when he writes that "the world in its present form is passing away." He is saying that your plans mean nothing, the kingdom of God is at hand. Abandon your nets, let your catch escape into the sea. You're not who you thought you were, and you don't need what you thought you needed.

Your sins do not define you. Your fears are not fate. Your inclinations do not govern you. Your life can be changed. We live in the time of fulfillment, and fulfillment is coming for you — ready or not.

## REFLECTIONS | SACRED HEART COUNSELING

In this weekend's Gospel, we hear the story of Peter and Andrew being called by Jesus. Something that I think we overlook in this Gospel passage is what Peter and Andrew left behind when they followed Christ. When they left their boats behind, it is easy to look at what they left behind as being insignificant. Having a boat in modern times is, generally speaking, a hobby. In the context of this Gospel passage, boats were more than just a hobby. Peter and Andrew were leaving behind their entire livelihood and investment in their career. Boats were very hard to make and very expensive. When we realize the sacrifice that Peter and Andrew made, we see the gravity of what we are called to do when we choose to follow Christ. Following Christ is no small matter and does not come without significant sacrifice. However, we know from our faith that significant sacrifice is very much worth it for the promise of Heaven and the closeness with God. There is nothing in this life that is worth more than our relationship with God and the promise of Heaven. Just as Peter and Andrew sacrificed their livelihood and investment to pursue God, we need to sacrifice anything that comes between us and God. This is no easy journey and we all have things that are difficult to sacrifice. If you find that there are things in your life coming between you and God, consider reflecting on the lives of Peter and Andrew and what it takes to become a follower of Christ. —Luke Brown

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

I am able to send this to Nina, our Office Manager, who in turn will send it off to the bulletin company, due to the WiFi that is available on the ship so it's good to be able to remain connected though I am far away. We're actually on a cruise ship in the Caribbean, not in the Bahamas as I previously and mistakenly wrote last week. I'm waiting to take a little excursion on St. Thomas island, and from there to St. John's. I was all signed up for an excursion with my sisters to go horseback riding yesterday but they called to get my weight as there is a limit (the horses can only take so much, after all). I won't tell you what the limit was, but I missed it by 5 pounds. One of my sisters said she understood why as she said, "I would laugh if I just pictured you on a horse" to which another said, "I would laugh by picturing the horse!" But in response I'll just say that I was called to give last rites to those horses after my sisters rode them. I sure hope my sisters don't mistakenly fall overboard. That's all I can say for now.

I used to take cruises for free as I would be invited by the cruise lines to be the ship's chaplain. I would celebrate Mass on Sunday, along with having a Protestant service (where I had to remember not to make the sign of the cross) and even a service for the Jewish people (where I only used scriptures from the Old Testament.) Those were great ecumenical experiences. But they don't have a Catholic chaplain on board this ship and so only have a Shabbat service, no Mass. So I celebrated Mass in my cabin last Sunday. It was the most expensive Mass I've ever celebrated as I had to order a glass of wine which cost me \$14.16 (gratuity included). But I was happy to be able to pray with you even though we were many miles apart.

I wanted to acknowledge Kathleen Schmidt whose funeral Mass was celebrated while I was away. Here is some information about her from her obituary: KATHLEEN A. SCHMIDT (nee Faulhaber), age 81. Beloved wife of the late Leonard Schmidt. Devoted mother of Laurie Mathis, Sheila Zemek (Rocky); loving grandmother of Devin Zemek and Amber Bilinovich (Garrett); dear sister of Don Faulhaber (deceased), Mary Gamble (Ben, deceased) and Frank Faulhaber (Michele); cherished aunt and friend of many. Passed away on Wednesday, January 10, 2024. Funeral Mass at St. Leo The Great, 4940 Broadview Rd, Cleveland, on Tuesday, January 16, 2024. Please keep her and all our beloved deceased in your prayers.

During this month of January, the Diocese of Cleveland celebrates Catholic Schools Week. We are very fortunate to still have a school as part of our parish here at St. Leo's. I am grateful that their parents have chosen to entrust their children to us and to support their education at a Catholic school, irrespective of their own faith background. The 8th graders come to Mass every Friday morning and we have a Mass with the whole school community about once a month. The children say the Pledge of Allegiance every morning and pray together before and after lunch. There are so many staff members who tend to these students throughout the day and we are very grateful to all of them. Jesus told his disciples that "their angels always behold the face of God in heaven."
