



On this feast of the Epiphany, we bring Christmas Time to a close & begin Ordinary Time on Monday. That means back to green vestments until we're reminded about Lent when we bring out the purple again. Our liturgical colors really help us to know where we are in the liturgical year. But before we leave our Christmas decorations behind, let me take the opportunity to thank those involved in our Christmas celebrations. First I thank the Art & Environment Committee for their time & work in decorating the church. They kept it consistent with past years yet added a couple of new ideas like poinsettias surrounding the Christmas trees & Manager scene. We have a beautiful church to begin with but the holiday decorations really make it stand out. My thanks also to Mickey Stitt, Julie Slattery & the choir, all of whom did a marvelous job providing us with beautiful music to celebrate this great feast. The children from our parish did a very admirable job during the 4pm Mass on Christmas Eve. It's so good to have them participate in the liturgy in this way. They and the adults put in so many hours of work but make it look so easy. Please be sure to let them know when the music touches your heart and helps you in the praise of God.

Thanks to the faithful lectors, altar servers, eucharistic ministers, ushers and Mass coordinators for their ministry, especially with the revised Mass schedule. Everyone worked so well together that you wouldn't know anything was different. Finally, thanks again to all of you parishioners for your cooperation and for being here week after week. I don't know where I'd be without faith, without the Church, and without all of you, my parish family members. God's blessings on you all in this new year.

You likely heard the news that Pope Francis has granted Bishop Lennon retirement status for health reasons. Retirement for bishops (and priests in the Diocese of Cleveland) is 75, but Bishop Lennon found it necessary to request an early retirement at the age of 69 due to health issues he has struggled with especially in recent months. We pray for his health and well-being as we thank him for his faithful work as Shepherd of our Diocese these last 10 1/2 years. We also pray for Bishop Daniel Thomas, bishop of the Toledo Diocese, who has been named Administrator for Cleveland until a new Bishop is appointed. You'll notice that we pray now for "Daniel our Bishop" during the Eucharistic Prayer. May the Lord help him in this interim time.

"I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?" Jesus didn't need to be washed clean of any sin, and John the Baptist knew it. But nonetheless, Jesus was humble enough to be baptized like the rest of us. This humility is at the heart of Jesus' mission on earth. As Saint Paul says, Jesus "emptied himself...coming in human likeness...he

humbled himself" (Phil 2:7-8). He did not need to become human, to be born of a woman into a poor family, or to suffer and die on the cross. Rather, Jesus freely chose to do all of these things out of love for us. And in the process, he gave us a model to follow.


