Tom enjoyed collecting spoons which people would bring to him from the various places they visited. But Tom will be especially remembered for his kindness to others. May he rest in God's peace.

We also had the Mass of Christian Burial for Thomas Emery. Tom was 91 years old & was very devoted to his family. He had 16 grandchildren & 5 great-grandchildren. He was also a very religious man who attended numerous retreats, and was a member of the Holy Name Society (a fraternal organization of men). He had a devotion to Mary & prayed the rosary. He read Scripture daily and prayed to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. His children remember him praying with them every night when they were young. May he receive his eternal reward.

The priests of the Diocese (except for myself) will be away this week for our Presbyterial Convocation (a "calling together of the priests") which we attend every other year at Sawmill Creek for 3 days. While I will be with them only in spirit, I ask that we all be with them in prayer as we seek to better serve you, the People of God.

I am so grateful to the many parishioners who have worked hard these last few weeks & months to prepare for our two day Fall Festival next Saturday & Sunday. It is a good time with delicious food, enjoyable music, games for the children & fellowship for all. I look forward to seeing many parishioners there and hope that our neighbors will join us as well.

Included in this bulletin is my annual letter to the parishioners along with our Summary Financial Report for the fiscal year of July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018. We were actually almost \$87,000 under budget (i.e., a surplus) due to our increased school enrollment (thanks to our Principal, Mrs. Burns). But the budget for this current fiscal year will have us tapping into our capital improvement funds to pay for the necessary replacement of the roofs on the church and parish center and some costly repairs on the gym. But you have been so faithful in your financial support of the parish as our collections have remained the same (many parishes lose between 2 & 4% per year). Thank you for your contributions especially to our capital improvements fund. Please feel free to ask me or a member of the Finance Council any questions you may have (their names are on the bottom of the Summary Financial Report) and pray that we may be good stewards of our parish goods.

Dear Parishioners of St. Leo the Great,

The Annual Summary Financial Report is for the fiscal year which began July 1, 2017 and concluded June 30, 2018. It is my responsibility as pastor to provide you with an overview of our parish finances and I am always happy to answer any questions you may have. As always, I am grateful to our Business Manager, Brenda Basalla, for her thorough work, and to our Finance Council which reviews our budget and our financial goals throughout the year.

Every year it seems that we are hit with several costly repairs to our buildings and property, but as we celebrate our 70th Anniversary, the church, rectory and office buildings are nearly 50 years old, and most of our school and gym buildings go back almost 70 years to our beginnings. We are fortunate to have enough in our capital improvement account to cover these large bills but the challenge will be to keep replenishing that fund. This past year, our largest expense was replacing the water pumps and computer system for our church HVAC system, but there are several other parts, including the boilers themselves, which will need to be replaced at some time in the future, hopefully later than sooner. Due to the high traffic in our Parish Community Center (the old convent) which is utilized for parish meetings and is also rented out frequently, we replaced the old carpet with a vinyl floor that is not only more attractive but much easier to keep clean, especially as that space is used frequently for eating and drinking. A new coat of paint and some other smaller upgrades made a huge difference in the appearance of those rooms on the 1st floor. We also replaced the deeply cracked sidewalk leading to the front doors of the school and continued to patch the worst parts of the two parking lots on either side of the church. Finally we continued to install newer, more energy efficient windows in the rectory and made repairs to the ceilings and walls of the rectory basement which is used for storage. Please note that these are the largest expenses but there are many additional expenses which must be budgeted to repair, replace and maintain our buildings and property. I'm very grateful to our maintenance department which works very hard throughout the year to keep our buildings safe, clean and in good working order.

Our collections continue to remain about the same (many parishes lose between 2-4% per year) so again I thank you for your faithful stewardship and encourage you to sign up for our electronic giving if you have not already done so.

We actually ended up with \$86,822.00 *under* budget (i.e. a surplus) due to our increased school enrollment. However the budget for this new fiscal year of 2018-19 expects a deficit of \$263,235.00 since we must replace the roofs on the parish center, bell tower, & church. Other necessary repairs for leaks in the church and gym will also greatly stretch our budget, and these are just the known repairs we need to make so far.

With God's help we will do our best to be good stewards of our parish property.




