Dear Parishioners,

Today is the feast of Christ the King and brings to a close the liturgical year which ends earlier than our calendar year. We begin a new liturgical year next weekend with the First Sunday of Advent. But in-between these two liturgical moments we have a secular holiday which certainly has roots in our Christian faith. We seek to express on Thanksgiving our acknowledgement of all the blessings that come to us from above. So please consider joining us for our Thanksgiving Mass at 9am this Thursday. We'll even give you a loaf of bread for joining us! No lunchmeat or PB & J though...you're on your own for that. The collection taken up at this Mass will be given to our St. Vincent de Paul Society. Remember too that with our new electronic giving option available through our website, you can not only have your weekend collection deducted automatically from your checking/savings account or via a credit/debit card, you can also choose, as you wish, to contribute something to our second collections or to our St. Vincent de Paul Society as well. It's nice to keep cash in your wallet or purse & be able to make donations online as many do with all their other bills. Give it a try as it's a big help to the parish. I just realized this paragraph went from liturgy to Thanksgiving to money. Pretty smooth, I'd say.

We do our best to keep up with parishioners who are ill but it's very challenging. These days people are moved into and out of hospitals so quickly. And it often happens that when trying to visit someone in the hospital or nursing home, they are out of their rooms for a test or physical therapy. My hope is that people don't fall through the cracks and continue to remain connected to the Church and the sacraments. I try to prioritize my visits to those who otherwise do not have a priest available to visit them, and to those who are critically ill or in hospice. And we have parishioners who generously visit those in Parma hospital. However sometimes we are not informed when people enter or leave a hospital or nursing home due to privacy laws. Please remember that most hospitals and nursing homes have a chaplain assigned to them for anointing and visits, as well as Eucharistic Ministers who bring Holy Communion. But at the same time, we are happy to visit with anyone when these are not available to them. I've also mentioned that we have a parttime staff member named Robin Imbrigiotta who is available for visits to the sick and homebound. We prefer that the individual contact us themselves if they are able to do so as to respect their privacy and to make sure they are the ones requesting a visit. I hope to discuss our ministry to the sick & homebound with the Parish Council so that we may do our best in reaching out to them during a time they really need our support.




