



Several people have been coming to the video series on Monday evenings during Advent where Bishop Robert Barron explains the parts of the Mass. It really helps us to engage more in this central act of Catholic Worship when we grow in our understanding of what it's all about. We'll have our last viewing this Monday at 7pm so feel free to join us even if you haven't seen the other 2 videos. This one will be on the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the 2nd part of the Mass. This week my cousin Father Dan Schlegel will be joining my sister and I in making homemade ravioli & soup noodles, the staple of the Schmitz Christmas (& Easter) family meals. My mom was the real expert at these Italian dishes though & even though she taught us how to make it before she died, we still can't get them to taste exactly like hers. Of course her recipe was typically Italian which means they don't use measuring cups or worry about ounces or and of those details. It's pretty much "a dash of this & a dash of that." Maybe it doesn't call for a bottle of wine but we're trying to be as creative as she was. Better to just stick to the ingredients she gave us, even if we're not sure of their exact measurements. But I'm glad that the recipe and the tradition has stayed with the family all these years & that my cousin wants in. We should probably charge him for the privilege since it is proprietary information but it is Christmas after all. Of course he'll have to do the kneading and the more tedious parts like forking the raviolis after the cheese has been placed between the layers of dough. But that's the cost of being included in secret family recipes. Hope he's up to the task.

Our 4th week of Advent this year will be very short since the final week of Advent which begins with our Masses next weekend is interrupted by Christmas Eve next Monday. That also means we have less time to get our Christmas shopping done. I'm glad I have a lot of elves to help with mine.


