

First Reading: Genesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7

The account of the sin of Adam and Eve is a classic example of how everyone sins. The author recognized that there is a standard pattern: We toy with temptation...we fall...then we make excuses.

Second Reading: Romans 5:12-19

Paul's letter to the Romans is his most detailed and important theological work. His purpose in this passage is not to teach about original sin, but to contrast Adam and Christ. From Adam we inherited a strong pull toward sin. From Christ (the "new Adam") we received a gift that is incomparably stronger: Divine grace.

INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK



We have begun Lent, entering into a season of conversion and repentance. Like us, Jesus was subject to temptation, but he resisted with all

his heart. As we celebrate our Eucharist today, let us ask God to give us the perseverance to avoid sin.

Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend we passed out a little black booklet to people as they came into the church for Mass. It has some brief but useful reflections for each day of Lent. If you didn't get one then or on Ash Wednesday, be sure to ask for one from an Usher or the receptionist at the Information Desk in the vestibule of the church. The members of the Parish Council and I are discerning what book we want to offer everyone at our Easter Masses. We are glad to have received such good feedback on the book we gave away at Christmas. If you haven't picked it up yet, take a look at it during Lent. The chapters are very brief & it takes only a few minutes a day to read. A test will be given before Easter (just kidding but read the book or at least give it away).

The Diocese began a capital campaign a few years ago & promised that each parish would receive back a certain percentage of what the parishioners had donated each month. In total, \$423,903 was pledged to that campaign by St. Leo parishioners, and we received \$106,792 in quarterly payments over the past 5 years. And we recently received about \$16,000 from a Rooted in Faith grant that will be used to replace the original wooden doors in our school with metal ones. So thank you for your sacrificial offerings which have been a great benefit to the parish. Since we will no longer be receiving these quarterly payments we will have to adjust our budget accordingly but we continue to depend greatly upon your financial support of the parish.

Just a couple of months ago we started offering you the option of making contributions online as more & more people are hoping to make their donations electronically as they pay their bills online. We already receive hundreds of dollars each week through that option and received over \$1500 in contributions the first week of February (where some people choose to make one contribution for the whole month). It's so easy to do & so flexible that anyone can do it. And if you're not a computer kind of person, we'll be happy to get it set up for you in the rectory office. Just call us or drop in. For those who are well-versed in the internet world, just stop by our website (leothegreat.org) & click on the WeShare icon. No more searching for your checkbook or cash or forgetting to bring your envelope to church. Modern technology has you covered. But it will always be your option.

There has been some recent vandalism in the neighborhood & in our parking lot this past month. I put safety and security at the top of the list when it comes to our parish. So we are working on having some kind of parking lot security during our weekend Masses (beginning last weekend) to ensure that someone is present & watching our property carefully before & during Mass. We will also install signs that inform others of our video surveillance. Remember the show that used to be on TV? "Smile, because you're on !"




