First Reading: Isaiah Acts 10:34, 37-43

The Apostle Peter was originally skeptical about preaching the Gospel to non-Jews. But one day, The Holy Spirit summoned him to preach to a Gentile—the pagan army officer Cornelius and his household. Today's passage is a portion of Peter's sermon, which summarizes the life and ministry of Jesus.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

The letter to the Colossians depicts Christ as the only mediator between God and the world. A previous passage of the letter presented baptism as the way we are united with Christ. The author will today remind us of the heights to which Christ has raised us, and then call upon us to live up to this.

Dear Parishioners,

Father Vesely and I wish all of the parishioners of St. Leo the Great a very Happy Easter, along with those who are visiting with us today. We hope that the beauty of the music, the flowers, and especially of God's people gathered together for worship, will encourage you to keep joining us throughout the year. Every Sunday we celebrate Easter for every Sunday we celebrate the Resurrection of Christ. It's not just a miraculous event that happened many years ago. It is a promise that we too will be raised to share eternal life with God and one another. It is the permanent sign of God's love and mercy. It is the Father's answer to the sacrifice of Christ to the Father and of his self-giving to us. In a word, it is everything. May she now be surrounded by the saints whose intercession we called upon in the hours before her death.

Anna Tulenew also lead a very full and useful life. Her funeral Mass was on March 23rd. Her daughter Olga wrote a very beautiful eulogy and her family honored her with roses placed on her casket and they expressed their thanks to her and for her. I had also anointed Anna and prayed the Last Rites for her while she was in the nursing home so she too received the prayerful support of the Church. Anna was known as "Babsa" and was revered by her family. May she and all of our departed parishioners celebrate forever the Easter that is eternal in heaven.

Several parishioners and staff members have been visiting Father Vesely at Mount Alverna and he thanks you all for your cards and prayers. His therapy is hard work and as many know, the progress seems slow. So please keep supporting him as we wait for him to return to us.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY



This week we celebrate the joy of Our Lord's Resurrection, the triumph over sin and death. Another feast follows next Sunday, the Feast of The Divine Mercy, a day set apart by the Church in response to the request Jesus gave to Saint Faustina in 1931.

On one occasion Our Lord appeared to Sister Faustina clothed in a white garment with two large rays, one red, and the other pale. He asked her to paint an image according to the pattern she saw with the inscription: Jesus, I trust in you.

On Good Friday we began the Novena and Chaplet of Divine Mercy. It is requested to be said daily until the Feast of Mercy. Pamphlets for this devotion are available at all the doors of the church.

Next Sunday, April 8th, a special program for Divine Mercy Sunday will be held at Mary Queen of Peace Church, at 4423 Pearl Rd. There will be Confessions from 1 to 2pm: Rosary at 2pm, Holy Mass at 2:30pm; the Divine Mercy Chaplet in Song at 3:30pm; and a reception at 3:45pm.
