#### **LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK**



### DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY 2019 COMMUNION RITE POSTURE RENEWAL RECOMMENDED PROCEDURES



Beginning Divine Mercy Sunday, we will be changing our Communion Rite posture to reflect the original policy, first established in 2003. We will remain

standing after the Lamb of God, throughout the distribution and reception of Holy Communion and the singing of the Communion Hymn, until the end of the distribution of Holy Communion. Once the last person has received Holy Communion and the Communion Hymn ends, we may kneel or sit for private prayer.

### First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

The Apostle Peter was originally skeptical about preaching the gospel to non-Jews. But one day, the Holy Spirit summoned him to preach to a Gentile—the pagan army officer Cornelius and his household. Today's passage is a portion of Peter's sermon, which summarizes the life and ministry of Jesus.

#### Second Reading: Colossiansl 3:1-4

The letter to the Colossians depicts Christ as the only mediator between God and the world. A previous passage of the letter presented baptism as the way we are united with Christ. The author will today remind us of the heights to which Christ has raised us, and then call upon us to live up to this.

Dear Parishioners,

I must begin this column by welcoming all of you who are with us today to celebrate this great feast of the Resurrection. To those who are faithful parishioners throughout the year and to those who are visiting with us from another parish or another place, we want you to know how good it is to have you here today. And most especially, we warmly welcome those who may have been raised Catholic and/or those who live in the area but who no longer practice the faith with regularity. We extend to you the peace of Christ, who extended his peace to his apostles the first time he appeared to them after he was raised from the dead. We speak of "practicing Catholics" because all of us, even the best of us, are still (& always will be) practicing how to relate lovingly to God and to each other. Together we offer this prayer of thanks for the hope given to each of us by the death and resurrection of Christ. It is that hope that allows us to live in a world that is so rife with conflict and despair.

Last week we invited everyone to take home with them a free book we have purchased called "What I love about being Catholic." It's not the kind of book you need to read cover to cover, but one you can just open and read one page or two at a time as it offers reflections on how the Catholic faith has helped people in the struggles of life. I hope it inspires you as it has me, to appreciate more deeply what Catholicism has to offer us. If you did not receive one last week, please be sure to take one (or more) home with you today. Perhaps you know of a family member or friend who may benefit from it.

Every year many parishioners work hard to make Lent and Easter special times for us here at St. Leo's...those who provide opportunities for almsgiving such as through our Have a Heart, Lend a Hand program (thanks to all for your great generosity!), those who practice many hours in the music ministry, those who make our beautiful church even more so by flowers, the children who acted in the Passion Play, and those who minister in some way, in any way, quietly but faithfully throughout the year. Our gratitude to all of you.

In the midst of joy and gratitude, I must also acknowledge the sadness of many who are grieving the loss of a young (32 year old), faith-filled woman named Caitlin Kacher, the daughter of Tim Soucek of our parish. She fought a battle with cancer for many months and did so courageously. She and her husband Todd were married here almost 4 years ago and she spoke of how it was the happiest day of her life. We were especially touched to see so many students from Avon High School (where she enthusiastically taught Spanish) who were here at her funeral last Monday to grieve and pray with us. But our grief reminds us, most especially on this particular day, that we always have hope because of how Christ accepted his death for the sake of us all. May Caitlin rest in joy and peace.





## DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY



This week we celebrate the joy of Our Lord's Resurrection, the triumph over sin and death. Another feast follows next Sunday, the Feast of The Divine Mercy, a day set apart by the Church in response to the request Jesus gave to Saint Faustina in 1931.

On one occasion Our Lord appeared to Sister Faustina clothed in a white garment with two large rays, one red, and the other pale. He asked her to paint an image according to the pattern she saw with the inscription: Jesus, I trust in you.

On Good Friday we began the Novena and Chaplet of Divine Mercy. It is requested to be said daily until the Feast of Mercy. Pamphlets for this devotion are available at all the doors of the church.

Next Sunday, April 28th, a special program for Divine Mercy Sunday will be held at Mary Queen of Peace Church. There will be Confessions from 1pm to 2:30pm, a talk by Dr. Catherine Moran about the connection between Fatima and Divine Mercy at 1:30pm, the chaplet at 2:30pm, reposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 2:45pm, Holy Mass at 3:00pm followed by a reception in the Marian Lounge.




