

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

Chapters 40-55 of the Book of Isaiah contain the message of a prophet who spoke to God's people during their exile in Babylon. Several times the prophet speaks about a servant who will one day deliver God's people. Because the servant is portrayed as suffering, Christians have traditionally identified Jesus with this suffering servant.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

In the years following Christ's death and resurrection, Christians began to develop the prayers and hymns that would become part of their rituals. In today's passage from the letter to the Philippians, Paul appears to be quoting an early Christian hymn celebrating the dying and rising of Christ.

We will have the Blessing of Food at Noon on Holy Saturday. Besides the usual 8am & 11am Masses, we will also have a 9:30am Mass Easter Sunday. Bring family & friends with you!

We are happy to have Father Dennis O'Grady help with weekend Mass, in addition to Father Joe Pednekar who will continue to help with confessions and Mass on occasion. Fr. O'Grady is retired and has served in several parishes in the Diocese as well as in El Salvador. We are grateful to both of these priests who enjoy praying with our parish community and are a big help to me, especially when I have RCIA, weddings & funerals on the weekend. Although Divine Mercy Sunday falls on April 23rd this year, the Sunday after Easter, we begin to prepare during Holy Week on Good Friday after the 7:30 a.m. morning prayer in the church. We will be praying the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy and Novena Prayer each morning after Mass during the week through the Saturday before the Feast.

On April 22, 1931 Sr. Maria Faustina Kowalska, now a canonized saint, was asked by Jesus in an apparition to become the apostle and secretary of God's Mercy. In it she revealed Jesus's request. "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, especially sinners. The soul that goes to confession and receives holy communion on that day shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment."

Several churches in this area will hold special Divine Mercy Devotions on the Feast. Details in a later bulletin.


