
I want to wish all the women of the parish a Happy Mother's Day. I've been thinking a lot about my mom lately as my sister and I were emptying the attic of my dad's house in Lakewood so that we could prepare to sell it now that my dad is in assisted living (and doing very well!). My sister and I came across many things that reminded us of our mom, who died in 2001 from colon cancer. She was the secretary of our parish, St. Mark, where we all grew up & went to school. Interestingly, she died on April 25th, which is the feast of St. Mark, and that year, was also Secretary's Day. One of the things we found in the attic were pictures from my brother's wedding back in the early 1980s. He happened to be married here at St. Leo's and so there was a picture showing my mom walking up the center aisle of our church wearing a beautiful long dress as well as a broad smile on her face. So when I process up that same center aisle as we begin Mass every weekend, I think of how I am I quite literally and symbolically walking in my mother's footsteps, whom I know would have been so happy that I am pastor here, where my cousin also served as a newly ordained priest. It's also a blessing for me to remember that my mom was here so long ago not only for my brother's wedding but also for the baptism of my triplet nieces whom I baptized here at St. Leo's (and as I type this on Wednesday, May 10th, it happens to be their 26th birthday!). The reason why I share all this with you is that for those who have a mother that is living, you can share with them one of your memories of them that makes you happy. For those of us who have a mother who has gone to the other side of life, we too can honor them by sharing a favorite story about them. We do this with the saints all the time, so why not with those whom we pray are also being prepared for sainthood in God's kingdom? May all living mom's enjoy this day with their loved ones.

The Patricia and James Huston Computer Lab

Throughout my time at St. Leo the Great Parish and School I have been humbled by the generosity of individuals, families, and organizations. The gifts of time, talent and financial support has allowed St. Leo's vision and mission of providing excellence in Catholic education to flourish into the 21st century.

Among these generous families are Patricia and James Huston and their children, Lisa, Mary, Dennis and Brian. Patricia and James were long time parishioners of St. Leo the Great. Their dedication, passion and faithfulness was palpable throughout their years as parishioners and that same spirit lives on in their children and grandchildren.

Patricia and James, children, Lisa, Mary, Dennis and Brian walked the halls of St. Leo the Great as students from 1973 - 1988. All of the children fondly recall their time here. Their parent's strong values and belief in Catholic education provided them with a solid foundation and moral development that has served them well into adulthood. Patricia was known to many for her unwavering devotion to Mary, the Mother of God. On this Mother's Day weekend and in the month of May in honor of Mary, we believe it is fitting and appropriate to share the news of their generosity with all of you.

Last summer the children of Patricia and James approached Father Jim and I about making a donation in their parent's memory to the St. Leo the Great School community. After much discernment and conversation about the best way to honor their parent's legacy and memory they decided to donate \$20,000 to allow for a total upgrade to the school computer lab. This generous gift has allowed for the purchase of 30 new desktop computers, licensing agreements, and software for our students. Prior to the upgrade, our computer lab was limping along. Day to day functionality was questionable and inconsistent which did not allow for maximum learning. In addition, last year the Ohio Department of Education informed us that all state testing MUST be done online. Knowing, that our computers were not able to support that need we applied for and were granted a one-year extension to make the necessary technological updates. With God's grace and the Huston's generosity we are pleased to say we now have a 100% functioning and updated computer lab.

We are deeply grateful to the Huston family for their generous spirit. Their memory will live on throughout the halls of St. Leo the Great as we continue the mission of Catholic education.
