



#### Dear Parishioners,

Diane Buccier was a longtime parishioner of St. Leo's & we celebrated her life with a Funeral Mass on May 20<sup>th</sup>. She is survived by her husband Ralph of 52 years and by her children: Mike, Joe, Dan, Karen & Pam, as well as her brother Glen. Diane led an active life of faith and it was important for her to have her children receive a Catholic education so she and Ralph sacrificed so that they could all attend our parish school here at St. Leo's. I had the opportunity to talk with Diane and to anoint her before her surgery and I was inspired by the love of her family & of her faith. We pray that she may join with her son Kenneth who died many years ago and with all the saints in their praise of God.

I want to share with you the details of the Bishop's letter concerning our liturgical practices beginning with the feast of Corpus Christi, June 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup>. First, a final reminder that "the Catholic Bishops of Ohio have announced the lifting of the dispensation to attend Sunday Mass & Holy Days of Obligation except for those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immune-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons." So we welcome back to Mass most of those who have stayed away as a result of the pandemic.

As of next weekend, Face masks will no longer be required but are strongly suggested for those who have not yet received the COVID-19 vaccine or are otherwise vulnerable. Please show respect to those who for personal reasons, choose to continue to wear face masks and practice social distancing. But social distancing will not be required and the use of all pews and seating areas will be permitted. Holy water will be returned to the fonts, including the baptismal font. We will begin to have liturgical processions again at the beginning & end of Mass & at the offertory and I will be happy to shake hands again with those who are comfortable with that, Though we will also begin exchanging the sign of peace again as well, it is recommended that peace be exchanged without physical contact between persons who are not of the same household or family. We will welcome back our liturgical ministers including ushers, cantors, choir members & Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Hymnals will be ordered and made available to you again in the pews and singing is once again permitted (& encouraged!). The only restriction still in place will be communion from the cup as this remains suspended until further notice. Of course we will continue to clean and sanitize the church to the best of our ability and hand sanitizers will be provided at the church entrances. We do ask that those who are not feeling well stay home as live streaming of all Masses will continue (both weekend and weekday Masses). Visiting to the homebound by clergy and parishioners is permitted though we encourage all to use good hygiene and to refrain from visiting when not feeling well. So let us be grateful that we can return to our pre-pandemic celebrations but continue to pray for a complete end to the coronavirus and to pray for all those who died from it & those who lost loved ones or whose employment has been adversely impacted by the pandemic. Again, a great big thank you for your wonderful cooperation during these last 15 months.

Our 9am Memorial Day Mass will take place outside by our Marian shrine, weather permitting. While we will have some benches available, we encourage you to bring a chair with you if you are able.



#### GOD DOESN'T TAKE A BREAK

An acquaintance who works in church ministry once told me a story about one of the students she had in Faith Formation. This student informed my friend that his family doesn't come to Mass in summer. "God takes a break in summer, and so do we," he said.

There's a lot to unpack here. First, it's tragic to think of anyone voluntarily missing out on the Eucharist for so long. It's also a real problem in the church today that a lot of our folks don't understand the beauty of the Sunday obligation. But if I had to dissect this situation and pinpoint the thing I find most troubling, it's the idea of God taking a break.

I hope it's starting to look like summer where you are. We've still got a few weeks left before it's official, but the school year should be winding up for most kids, the birds should be chirping a little louder, and hopefully your lawn is starting to green up nicely. You're probably daydreaming about the annual cabin getaway weekend or waterskiing on the Fourth of July.

All in all, summer is going to be a nice break, even if — like typical Americans — our break is full of productive work.

Thank God — literally — that He doesn't take a break, even if we do. Can we try to remember that, even in the midst of our many wonderful distractions? Let's enjoy this summer. Let's live it to the full. But let's see it for the gift that it is — and remember the thanks we owe the Giver.

#### Ouestion:

If it isn't only for people who are dying, when should someone receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick?



#### Answer:

One of the unfortunate realities in the Church today is that so few people understand the meaning and value of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, largely because so many people still mistakenly think of this sacrament as "Last Rites" or "Extreme Unction."

In his life and ministry, Jesus healed the sick. In this sacrament, the Church continues the healing mission of Jesus and, in hope, prays that God will grant healing to the person who is suffering. But even if there is no physical healing, the sacrament offers spiritual healing through the Holy Spirit's gifts of peace and courage. And so, anyone who is living with serious illness (including emotional or psychological illness) and the elderly are encouraged to celebrate this sacrament when it is needed.

The ritual for Anointing of the Sick does also include special prayers and blessings for those who are facing death, including viaticum (communion given to the dying, trusting that the Lord Jesus will be their companion along the way, as they make their final journey).

#### **COVID-19 VACCINES FOR HOMEBOUND INDIVIDUALS**

The City of Cleveland in partnership with the Western Reserve Area Agency and Cuyahoga County has launched a COVID-19 vaccination program for individuals who are homebound.



For individuals who have not received a COVID-19 yet due to being homebound or bedridden, Cuyahoga County and the City of Cleveland have a vaccination program to vaccinate individuals in their home. A homebound person includes those who need the help of another person, a walker or a wheelchair to leave their home, or their medical provider believes that their health or illness could get worse if they leave their home, therefore, they do not typically leave their home. To check eligibility and register yourself or a loved one, please contact the Western Reserve Area Agency on Aging as they are providing screening for eligibility at 216-621-0303.
