

#### First Reading: Wisdom 1:13-15,2:23-24

The book of Wisdom was addressed to a group of Jews living in Alexandria, Egypt. It begins with a sharp contrast between good and evil. In the pagan would of that time, most people believed that there were good gods and bad gods. The author emphasizes the Jewish belief that there is just one God who is the source only for goodness and life.

#### Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15

Today's excerpt from Second Corinthians paints a picture of Paul the pastor at work. The Jewish people in Jerusalem who had become Christian were a small minority and were being persecuted. This brought on financial hardships. Paul wants his Gentile converts in Greece to help them out and show that the bonds of Christianity cut across ethnic lines.

Dear Parishioners,

Due to the pandemic, it has been almost a year & a half since I have met with either the Parish Council or the Finance Council. These are advisory groups to the Pastor who help set the direction of

the parish in both temporal and spiritual ways, working with the Pastor to form a vision for the financial and spiritual health of the parish community. Neither Council makes decisions regarding the parish but provide valuable insight to the Pastor in his ministry to the people. I am deeply grateful for those who have been part of these councils since I have been here at St. Leo's. They have brought your questions to my attention and have allowed me to share with them my vision and plans for our parish community. We normally take the summer off from our meetings so I thought this would be a good time to begin preparing for new council members which would begin to meet in the fall. Though the Diocese recommends that we have a regular turn-over of council members (i.e., term limits), I realize that we have had many of the same members serving on these councils for several years. So I thought this would be a good opportunity to release our present council members from this responsibility and to ask other parishioners to be members of these councils. I am currently making a list of people whom I would like to ask to be a member of either the Finance or Parish Council. So if I ask you to consider doing this, you'll have some background as to why I am asking. The time commitment is very manageable and the only qualification is a desire to be of service to the parish in this way. The Finance Council meets quarterly, about 4 times a year. The Parish Council meets monthly, except during the summer months. No other time commitment is asked of you, and you will not be asked to engage in any other ministry just because you are a member of either council. We keep the meetings to no more than one hour long. We will limit the number of years that someone would be a part of either council (e.g. to 2 or 3 years) and of course if you can't make a particular meeting or need to be removed from council for some reason, that is very acceptable. The Principal, along with Deacon Pat & Joan Berigan are part of the Parish Council "ex officio" or by virtue of their office or ministry at the parish so they are automatically members of the Parish Council and will at times attend Finance Council meetings as well. So again, my sincere thanks to all those who have served on either council and thank you in advance to those who will willingly serve on these councils beginning in the fall.

We have had several people express interest in the position of being Coordinator of our Parish Center so we will once again be opening this space up for rentals in the very near future. For now, please call the rectory office if you are interested in using this space for a one time occasion or for regular gatherings. Priority is always given to the parish's use of this space. We will provide more information in the near future regarding rentals and we are glad we can offer this location for meetings, family celebrations, etc.

## CATHOLIC RENEWAL MINISTRIES' 38TH ANNUAL SUMMER CONFERENCE





Facilitated by Mike Reiling, M.Ed. This 8 session Teilhard virtual program details the significance of Pierre Teilhard de Chardin (1881-1955) for 21st century life. His personal story, his valuable and lasting insights into evolution and into spirituality will be examined as well as his continuing influence on contemporaries such as theologian Ilia Delio and evolutionary biologist David Sloan Wilson.

#### **Miraculous Medal**

Question: What is the "Miraculous Medal" and why is it called that?

#### Answer:

The medal of the Immaculate Conception that has come to be called simply the "Miraculous Medal" dates back to an apparition of Mary to Saint Catherine Laboure, who was then a novice sister with the Daughters of Charity. On November 27, 1830, Our Lady appeared to her standing on a globe, with shafts of light streaming from her hands and the words, "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee," surrounding the image. In the same vision, Catherine saw a capital "M" with a cross above it and below two hearts. Catherine seemed to hear a voice telling her to have what she saw struck as a medal and a promise that those who wore the medal would have the protection and intercession of the Mother of God. The first 1,500 of medals were distributed in 1832. Many miraculous favors were attributed to the use of the medal.

Saint Catherine's "Miraculous Medal" is among the recognizable and popular symbols of modern Catholicism. Reflecting on its widespread use, the 2001 Vatican document, "Directory on Popular Piety and Liturgy," observes that the medal "recalls the mystery of Redemption, the love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and of the Sorrowful Heart of Mary. It signifies the mediatory role of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the mystery of the Church, the relationship between Heaven and earth, this life and eternal life."
