First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

Pentecost was a Jewish feast that celebrated the beginning of the harvest. It took place 50 days after the feast of Passover. Jewish pilgrims came to Jerusalem from all over the ancient world for the celebration. Today we hear how Pentecost became a Christian feast.

Second Reading: 1Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13

Paul's first letter to the Corinthians responds to a letter they wrote to him. They had asked him how to deal with the diversity of gifts in the community, and the rivalries and jealousies that inevitable arose. In today's passage, he uses a comparison that we will recognize immediately.

PASTOR'S DESK



Dear Parishioners,

Last Friday we celebrated the Mass of Christian Burial for Stanley Sienkiewicz. He served in the Air Force and so had military honors at the cemetery service, most appropriate as we celebrated Memorial Day over that weekend. May he and all who served in the military rest in peace as we remember them in prayer and gratitude.

We will watch another one of Bishop Barron's Catholicism videos next Sunday, June 11th. He will be speaking about the Communion of Saints. Feel free to join us (coffee & donuts will be available) in the Parish Center at 9am.

We welcome Jameson Jarrett into the Church as he is baptized next Saturday. We never tire of celebrating the new life that is given both in birth and in baptism.

When I was with the children in the church as they were practicing for their First Holy Communion a few weeks ago, one of them asked me if I live here at the church. I told them I did live here & they wondered where my bed was! I had to explain that I lived in the rectory building attached to the church, not in the church building itself. Though there are some priests in our Diocese and elsewhere who live in an apartment or house that is not on church property, it is very convenient of course to live in a rectory so that I can say that I work at home (or do I live where I work?). Is it an advantage to live on church property? Well, there is a saying amongst us priests that if you ask six priests about something, you will get 10 opinions! We do like to let people know what we think about things. But today as we celebrate the feast of Pentecost, we remember that it is the Holy Spirit whose wisdom we all depend on. May that Holy Spirit be generous to us as we continue our parish and Church mission of spreading the good news that God is with us always...whether we are in church or at work or at home (or at all the above at the same time).

This week on June 7th, my classmates and I celebrate our 31st anniversary of ordination, when I first started to live in the church! It continues to be a great joy to serve you and I ask only for your prayers that I and my classmates may do that well.

I wrote last week that from time to time I'll share a quote with you. Here's one pertaining to whether we are in or out of the Church (church with a small c and Church with a big C): "You're not too bad to stay out and your not too good to come in." During the summer months especially, it is good to remember how much we all need Church, whether we lean more on the sinner or the saint side. So I welcome you once again to my home and yours as I say, "see you in church."

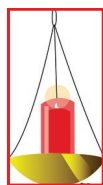

PLENARY INDULGENCE FOR THE CENTENNIAL OF THE FATIMA APPARITIONS

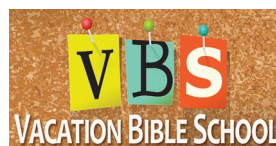

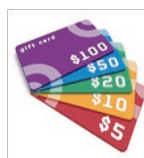

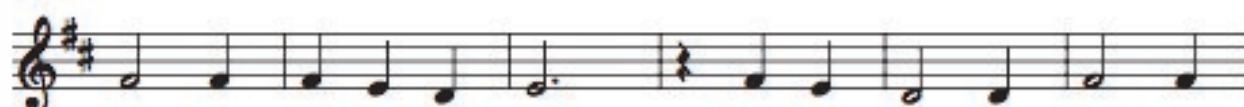
