

#### First Reading: Jeremiah 23:1-6

The prophet Jeremiah preached some 500 years before Christ, at a time when unworthy kings ruled the Jewish people. He looked to the day when God would raise up a good shepherd from the House of David. Later, the Gospel writers emphasized that Jesus was born of the House of David, and Christians have seen him as the fulfillment of this prophecy.

#### Second Reading: Ephesians 2:13-18

Our second reading is from the letter to the Ephesians. Ephesus was a community made up of Jewish people who had become Christian, and Gentiles who had become Christian. In this part of the letter, the author is addressing Gentiles—people who were once "far off" from the true God, but have "come near". As a result, both Jews and Gentiles are together as one "new person", namely the Body of Christ which is the Church.

Dear Parishioners, I am writing this on the evening before my trip to Florida, knowing that I'm probably not going to be wanting to do it while on vacation, so this needs to be submitted before I

leave. I am all packed & ready to go but I have to admit that trying to get emails answered, phone calls made, and the desk cleared, besides packing & going through the hassle of airport security, makes me wonder at times if it's worth the hassle. This is especially true as I get older, and I'm pushing 61 (or rather it's pulling me!). On the other hand, how blessed we are to live in a time of history when we can get on a plane & fly to the southern most part of the country within just a few short hours. It took days for the Holy Family to travel (on foot mostly, with perhaps the help of a camel or donkey) just to travel a few miles every year to the Temple, which they were required to make as an annual pilgrimage. And that was without the distraction of cell phones, social media and all the other things that tend to help us pass the time quickly. So I try to just be grateful for the opportunity rather than complain about the hassle (you didn't hear me complaining, did you?). The other hard part is leaving Michaela & Abby for a week & entrusting them to the care of others. But again, I'm grateful that others are willing to help with that too. So hopefully by the time you read this (I'll be arriving back in Cleveland near midnight on Saturday the 17<sup>th</sup>), I'll be celebrating the two Masses on Sunday morning (the 18th), and thank Deacon Pat in advance that he will be preaching so that's one less thing for me to do before my return.

This weekend we welcome our friends from Bethlehem (originally...they live in the States now) who will be selling beautiful olive wood pieces, made by the people in the Holy Land. Please support them (plus save yourself the time of looking for gifts for others) since you'll actually be supporting their families in the Holy Land who continue to struggle, especially as a result of COVID.

Our trip to the Holy Land, by the way, is still on and I am really looking forward to that experience next May. We are in the midst of planning an informational meeting to take place in the coming weeks, but I also need to tell you that spots for this pilgrimage will be limited to about 30 people right now & we already have several people lined up from other parishes who are interested in joining us. Several of you expressed interest to me last year & I have a list of who you are, but please let me know again of your intentions to go so that I can keep track of availability. I have a sister & brother-in-law who are going and I'm anxious to share this journey with them as well. You'll see posters in the church soon about this trip & we'll have informational brochures available as well, including the cost.

Before leaving on vacation, Deacon Pat & Joan Berigan & I were able to take Father O'Grady out to dinner. It was great to see him & he is doing pretty well but he is not strong enough to celebrate Mass on his own. We celebrated two special occasions with him: his 88<sup>th</sup> birthday on July 4<sup>th</sup> (they have fireworks for him every year) and his 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary as a priest. He was ordained on May 20, 1961. I sent him your love and prayers & he sends the same to you as well.





## **EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - REC-OGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS**

The Steward's Work Is Never Done

Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock! When you hear these strong words from the Old Testament, you're probably thinking, thank goodness I don't have any sheep — dodged that bullet. Nobody misled here! No flock scattered on my watch! However, we are all shepherds of a kind, called to tend our own sheep: our families, our parishes, our communities.

But it's exhausting. Don't we all sometimes just want to take a break from being a steward? The excuses are so familiar: we're tired, we've done enough, we've given all we can, what more does the parish (or my spouse, or my kids, or my boss, or my friends, or my community) want? We give ourselves permission to be selfish. So, what if the flock scatters just a little?

Jesus gets that. We can just imagine him weary with exhaustion, can't we? We see him on his boat, attempting to sneak away for a quick break — maybe just a chance to eat a bite of food in peace. He is God, but he was still human, after all. Even the most dedicated shepherds need to sleep. But people couldn't leave him alone. They were hungry for him. They needed what he could offer, and they needed it now.

As tough as it is, that's the example we are tasked with imitating. Everyday Stewardship demands accountability. It demands our showing up even when we are tired. It demands that we look at our lives, our time, our energies, our talents, our hearts, our bank accounts and think: where do I still have more to give?
